The motto of the program is Inspirational Education for Global Citizens. Helping children become Global Citizens is our goal here at CISB as well. And I'm sure they'll have a good time.



























Grade 5 students worked on poster presentation on "Bully & Violence". They also worked on "Non Renewable energy sources" in Science class & made an informative chart work on it.











Grade 6/7 ICT project: The students of grade 6 and 7 made a poster on MS Word on Victory Day during their ICT class.












Grade- 7 Chemistry Project:

The students made projects in teams to showcase the comparison between acids and alkalis to enhance their understanding of the topic.






Students of grade 9 created a collage on what it means to be Canadian. They highlighted Canada's culture, diversity, and trade.
