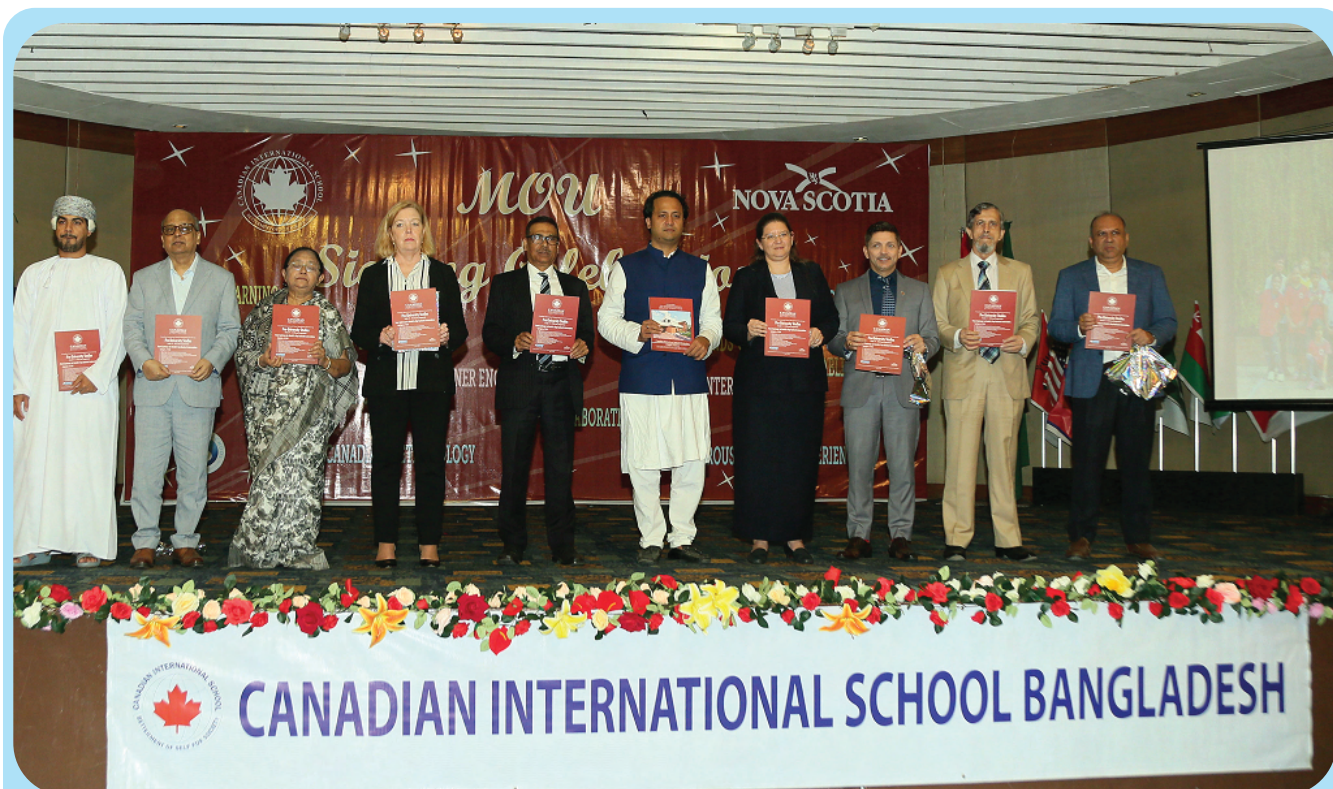

MOU Signing Celebration

The Canadian International School Bangladesh (CISB) on Monday, February 27, 2023 unveiled the Pre-University studies prospectus. A memorandum of understanding was signed between the CISB and Nova Scotia Department of Education Ministry, Canada at a hotel in Dhaka.

The MoU will help CISB students to get admitted directly to Canadian universities and universities around the world, said a media release.

Deputy Education Minister Mohibul Hassan Chowdhury was present as the chief guest. Dr. Vera Grayson-Kocay, former director of International Programs and Jerry Thibeau, Director International Programs, Education and Early Childhood - Development, Nova Scotia, Canada were also present.

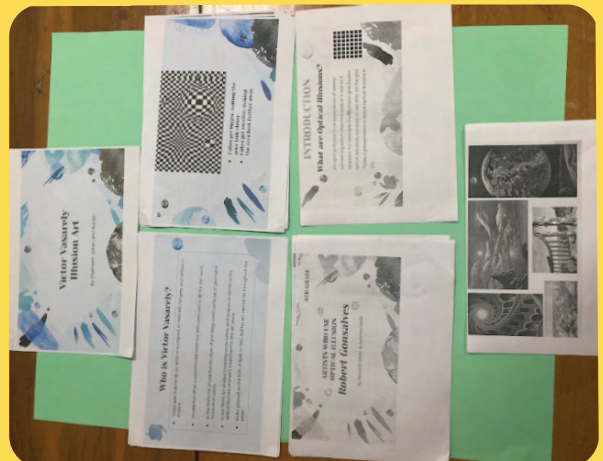
Aariyan and Johan construct a three-storey hydraulic bridge. They can manage the ascent and descent of three bridges using Pascal's law.
