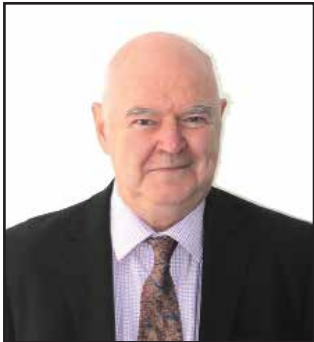

Because safety has been our primary consideration, it was necessary to go to online learning several days a week. Our concerns were for both our students whose travel might bring them into contact with unsafe conditions and some of our teachers who faced the same dilemma. The Schools

have now moved back to in-class learning and will continue with this as long as possible. Hopefully, these problems will disappear following the election date.

Online schooling has presented many challenges. For our younger students, it has been a giant imposition on parents who were forced to take on the role of a teacher assistant. While it was perhaps a bonus to spend time with your children and work with them on schooling, this has also damaged some parents' social lives and imposed a rigorous time constraint that many were not prepared for. For our high school students, on-line schooling was an opportunity to sleep in and avoid challenges. For them, the consequences may be more serious when it comes time to register for university. While much of Bangladesh has been shut down, students in other countries faced no such obstacles. As a result, our students' grades may not match those of students from other countries where there was no shutdown. It would be unusual for a university to consider this.

Regardless, we seem to be back on track now. A big thank you to those parents whose time and energy went into helping our children. Education is always a team sport, and you certainly played your part this fall. For our older students, now is the time to recognize that your future success depends upon your current success. It is time to be the best student you can be. Your parents and teachers are counting on you.

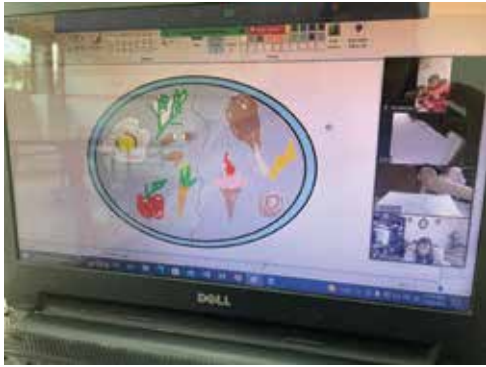

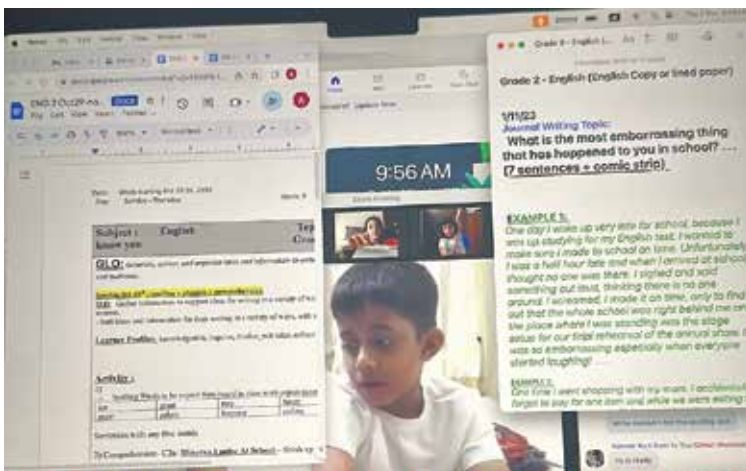
Grade 2

Grade students are using Venn diagram to sort three attributes.

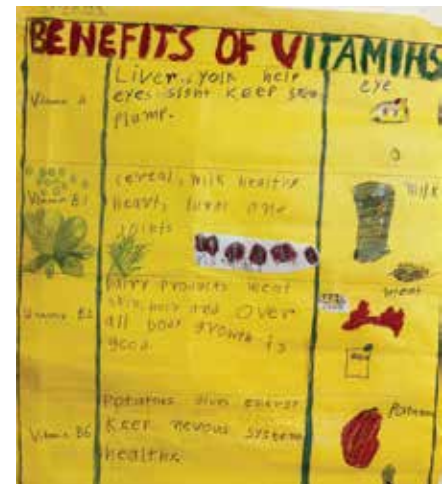


Zoom classes filled with writing prompt activities and exam reviews.



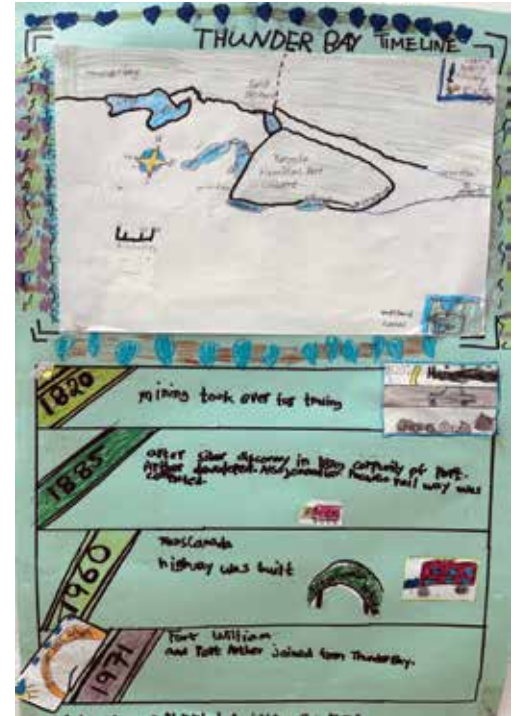
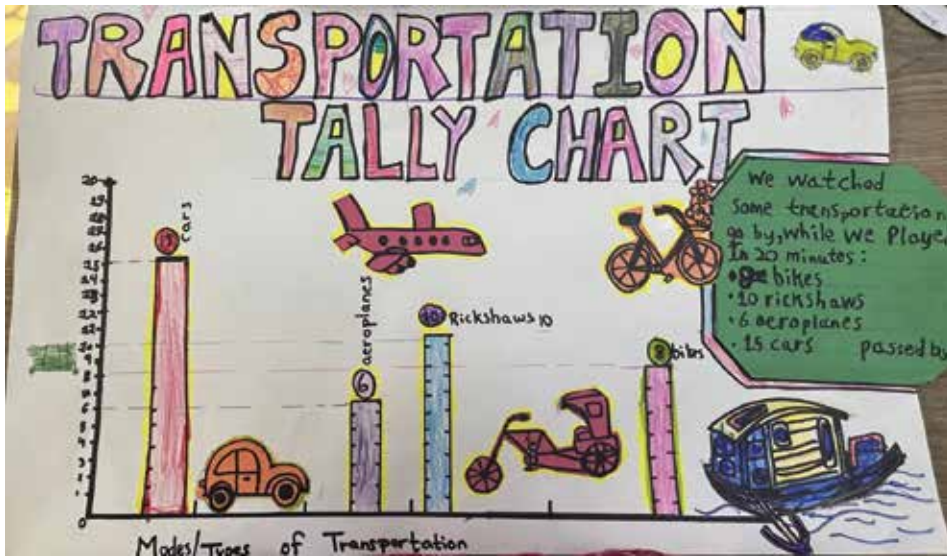
Grade 2 learnt about various symbols and some components of maps.

Grade 3



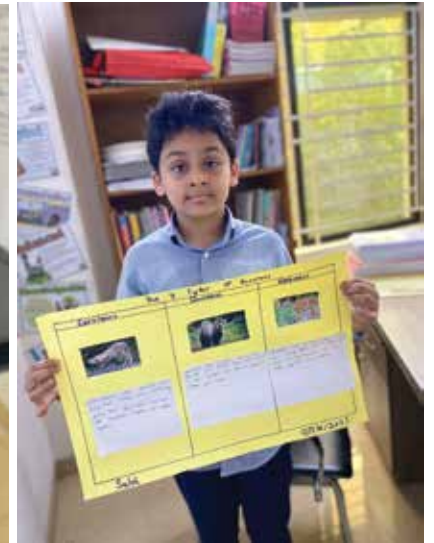
As an extension to the stories covered in Cornerstones, we chose our favorite characters from the different stories and elaborated on why we connected with their feelings.

It was very informative to learn how each vitamin benefits our body and mind.

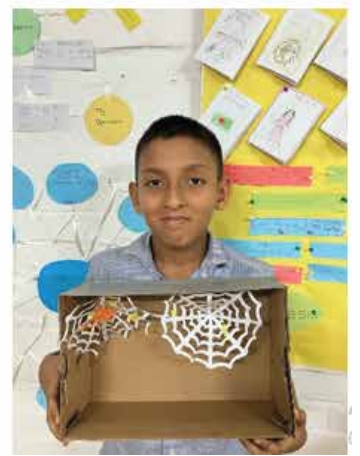


As an exam review, we did a timeline of all events that happened over the past century in the Thunder Bay community. We also finished a Transportation Tally Chart as a class.

Grade 4

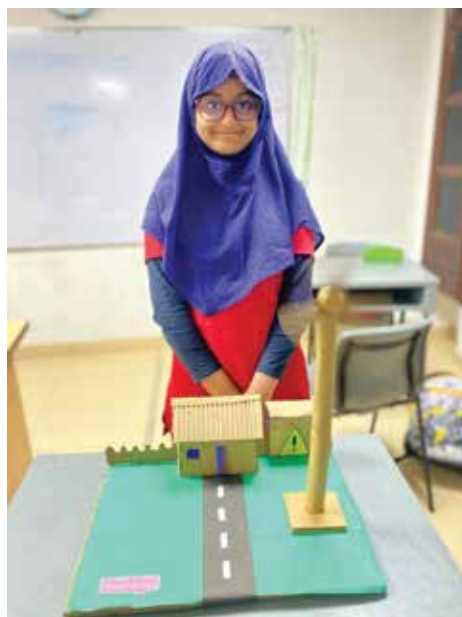


Grade 4 did a chart presentation showing the types of consumers & their eating habits.

Grade 5



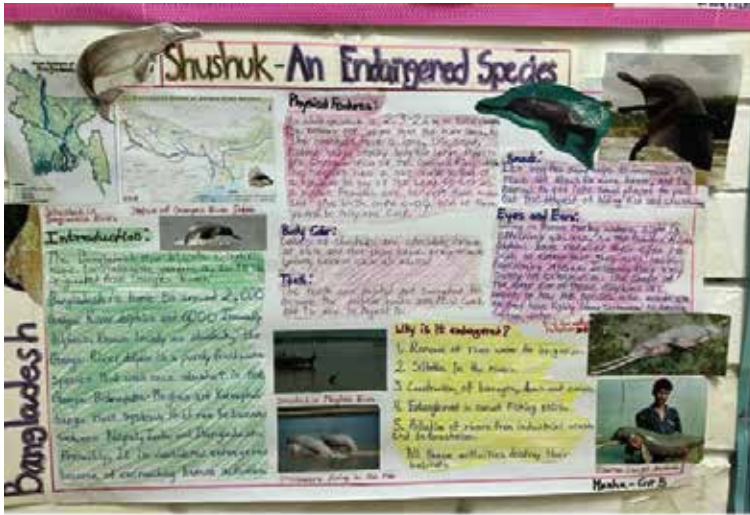

Social Study poster presentation about the early civilization: Mesopotamia.

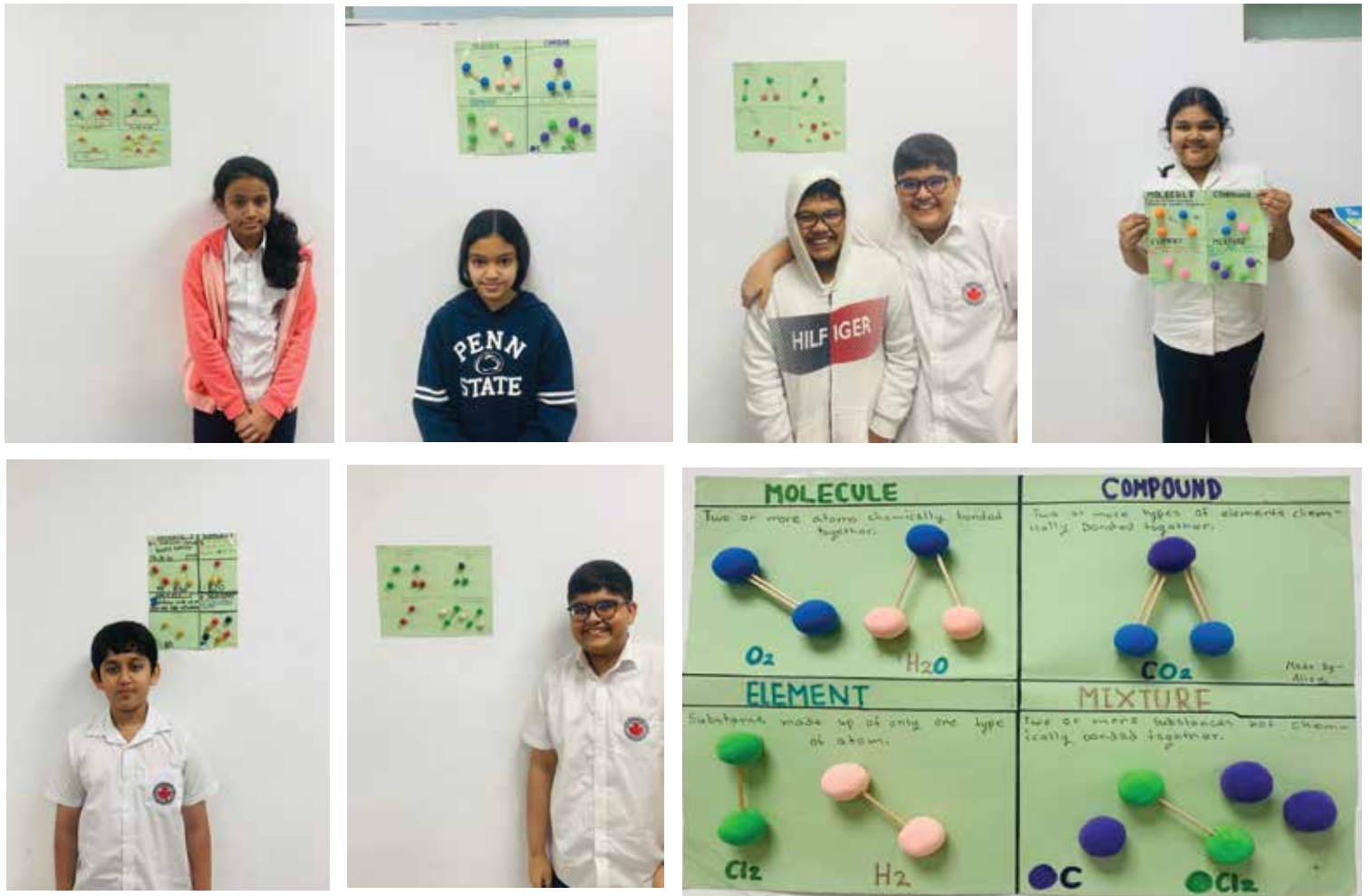


Grade 5 students have researched and created posters about endangered animals in Bangladesh.

The students built different atomic models to better understand the concept of atoms, molecules, elements, compounds and mixtures.

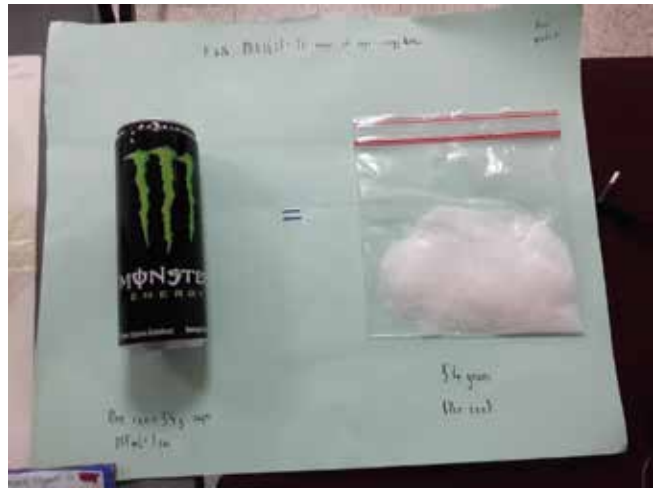
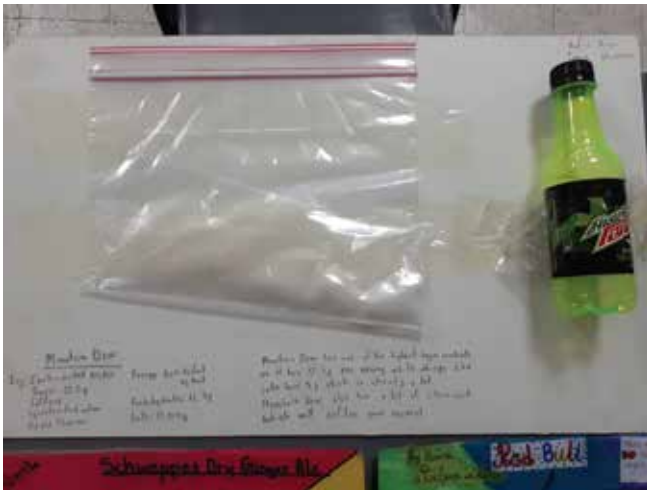
Grade 7
